#### **RUSH SKELETONWEED Plant Guide - USDA**

Fahrenheit (15 degrees Celsius) are needed for flower and seed production Rush skeletonweed has no absolute requirement for vernalization although it accelerates flowering It is found on a wide range of soil types but is most abundant on sandy, sandy-loam, and silt loam soils It is a weed of cultivated sites, open areas and disturbances

d Use only weed-free seed, soil, and feed e Limit soil disturbances and revegetate disturbed ground with desirable species f Contain animals that have fed on weed-infested forage for at least 3 days to allow pass-through of weed seeds g Dispose of aquarium plants away from natural waterways h Monitor beneath bird feeders for invasive

### **Invasive Weed Field Guide - National Park Service**

Lower part of flower forms a slender tube Six drooping stamens (male part of flower), tipped with brown pollen, emerging from flower tube Flowers 05 to 1 inch wide alternately arranged on a stalk Young flowers have a honey-like fragrance When does it flower? Blooms from late winter through spring Onion Weed *Asphodelus fistulosus*

### **Common Invasive Plants Easy ID Cards**

Flower: Small, white, 5-petaled flowers develop in May-June The sepals (the outmost part of the flower) are hairy and longer than the petals, giving the flowers an "unopened" look Fruit: The fruit are clusters of bright red edible berries produced in early summer (B) The seeds are ...

### **Nevada Noxious Weed Field Guide - Nevada Department of ...**

Flower Small yellow flowers (01 in wide) with 4 petals; clustered at tips of branches Seed pod is oval, 01 in long and borne on a 03-06 in long stalk Root Thick, fleshy taproot with creeping roots

### **Invasive Weeds of the Appalachian Region**

Hand-pulling can greatly disturb the soil allowing other weed seeds to germinate and/or damaging roots of surrounding de-sirable species Mowing Mowing is appropriate for herbaceous species and woody spe-cies with young/small stems This method should be consid-ered for any size infestation that allows access of motorized equipment

### **FNR-477-W Invasive Plant Series**

Japanese chaff flower, hereafter referred to as chaff flower, is a member of the Amaranth family It is a perennial herb that can reach heights of 3-6 feet It forms very dense stands (Fig 1) Mature plants have extensive root systems supporting multiple stems Chaff flower begins growing in late spring and flowers in late July The leaves

### **Kansas' Noxious Weeds**

Bull thistle is a county-option weed Multiflora rose — A large shrub in the rose family The plant has arching stems armed with claw-like prickles The white to pink flowers occur in clusters at the ends of stems This Asian plant is found throughout Kansas Multiflora rose is a county-option weed

### **Troublesome Weeds of New Mexico**

Flower heads (1.5-2 in diameter, 1-2 in long) found at end of each branch, gumdrop shaped or spherical, often covered with fine, cobweb-like hairs; flowers are purple, rarely white; below flowers are many long, stiff, yellow or green spiny bracts (1-1.5 in long) Roots:

Flower farmers charged more for their most beautiful, biggest, nearly flawless flowers Sumiko graded the best carnations #1, and the next best #2 Only carnations were graded inside the shed The stock were graded right out in the field The worst carnations farmers sold were splits—flowers where the calyx didn't hold the petals together

identified by its bright orange flower clusters on the end of long, leafless stems up to 2 feet tall Each dandelion-like flower is about 1 inch across Leaves are long and taper to a point and grow from the base of the plant The stems, leaves, and flower buds are covered with small, bristly hairs Stems exude a milky sap when broken

### **Spotted touch-me-not, jewelweed *Impatiens capensis***

Irregular flower Plant type: Flowering perennial Bloom period: July - September Distinguishing characteristics: Alternate oblong leaves with rounded teeth and a succulent stem Orange flowers with darker orange spots, on stems that dangle from a stalk that is as long as or longer than the flower itself The flower ...

### **CAUTION - ferti-lome**

General Weed Control: Use near fences, in paths, patios, sidewalks, curbs and driveways, around ornamental trees, shrubs, flower beds and plantings, around buildings Kills weeds in brick and gravel walks Use for trimming and edging landscapes Not recommended for spot weed control in lawns, since HI-YIELD® SUPER CONCENTRATE KILLZALL®
